# 1) Key Issues and Areas of Concern

#### **New Items:**

- a) Meetings are required with agencies and other stakeholders throughout the valley to discuss design issues particularly related to roadways, hydrology, and utilities. The Joint Venture (JV) has highlighted the relevant third parties to PMT. However, as a result of lack of agreements between the Authority and the appropriate parties, the JV has been prevented from meeting with the majority of these stakeholders. This will impact the ability to implement changes to the Volume III drawings for the Final Environmental Impact Report/Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIR/FEIS) and the request for proposal (RFP) documents.
- b) In order to deliver the invoice on September 10, 2012, the JV partners billed only the hours for the first four weeks of August on Invoice 7.02, and will bill the hours that occurred August 27 through August 31, along with September charges, on Invoice 7.03.

# **On-Going Items**

- c) **RBNSF:** The Joint Venture (JV) Board of Control is in discussions with the California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) and Project Management Team (PMT) to resolve the issue regarding additional 15% design and environmental analysis for the Revised BNSF (RBNSF) Alignment.
- d) **Tier 1 Approvals:** The JV has identified additional key Tier 1 personnel who are required to augment or replace staff working on the project. Personnel Request Forms (PRFs) have been submitted, with the oldest dating back to September 15, 2011, for Chris Adams of Hatch Mott MacDonald, who is currently serving as the Deputy Engineering Manager. The delay in approving these personnel is creating a hardship for the JV, as well as challenges in allocating resources to keep the project on schedule.
- e) **NODAs**: The Authority has not authorized contact for acquisition of any state, city, or railroad parcels, or for several of the privately owned parcels along the Construction Package (CP)1 right of way (ROW). The appraisal process for the parcels where the Notice of Determination to Appraise (NODA) was not authorized by June 30, 2012, will not be completed by October 30, 2012, when acquisition funding is expected. This projection is based on an assumed 14-week period between the time of the initial owner contact and approval of the appraisal by the Department of General Services.
- f) McKinley Avenue: Caltrans has requested that a roundabout be constructed at the northbound off-ramp from State Route 99 at McKinley Avenue. This design is not included in the Merced to Fresno Final EIR/EIS. The roundabout design would require different ROW information for 10 parcels. The JV has been directed to proceed with finalizing the appraisal maps, however the appraisals in this area will not begin until a decision is made to include or exclude the McKinley roundabout design, and proper Authority authorization has been provided.
- g) **Geotechnical:** The JV did not receive a Notice to Proceed (NTP) for commencement of geotechnical exploration permitting activities for Packages 2, 3, and 4 by June 30, 2012. A new Change Request (CR135) was filed for FY12/13 on July 10, 2012, with a revised

schedule contingent on receipt of NTP by July 16, 2012. Continued delay in receiving that NTP is resulting in a day-for-day delay in completion of the ground investigation, analysis, and deliverables. CR135 was presented by the PMT to the Change Control Board on August 16, 2012. As the JV understands it, the Change Control Board indicated that funds for geotechnical investigation will be drawn from construction funding, which is in processing for disbursement sometime in October or later. As a result of this delay in commencement of the investigation, the Geotechnical Data Report will not be available for the current addenda date, and the current structural design for Packages 2, 3, and 4 will not be based on site-specific ground conditions. The JV has proposed analysis that bounds the upper and lower extents of anticipated geotechnical conditions to reduce uncertainty in estimating viaduct costs. Direction on this approach has been requested from PMT.

# 2) Financial Reporting


On July 27, 2012, the JV received NTP-1 that allocated a budget of \$6,700,000 for Tasks 1 through 9 and a budget of \$3,550,000 for Task 10, for an FY12/13 NTP-1 budget of \$10,250,000. The planned total budget established in the FY12/13 Annual Work Plan (AWP) –Version 3 of \$28,346,621 is reported in the tables and charts below.




# b. Dollars Spent

- c) Begin Phase II ESA's if approved by the Authority.

# 10.6 Draft/Final Relocation Planning Services

a) Continue meeting with the property owners and property assessors to determine the needed relocation efforts for CP 1.

# 10.7 Utility Relocation Assistance

- a) Continue to provide assistance as requested by the PMT and Authority.
- b) Provide response to public inquiry regarding a temporary construction easement on private landowner property in Kern County.

# 10.8 Task Management

- a) Hold bi-weekly team meetings and address any new schedule or scope issues associated with the authorized budget.
- b) Monitor subconsultant performance.
- c) Monitor budget, schedule and technical controls for internal staff and subconsultants.
- d) Continue outreach efforts associated with right-of-way appraisals.
- e) Prepare invoice, monthly progress report, and travel requests.
